



*Harvest Hat and
Scarf Wine Cozy Set*

Harvest Flat and Scarf Wine Cozy Set



EASY

MATERIALS

- Cascade Yarns 220 Superwash: 100% Superwash Wool; 100 g (3.5 oz) / 220 yds (200 m) 1 skein of color #253 Desert Sun, 1 skein of color #858 Dark Ginger, 1 skein of color #1961 Camel
- Stuffing / Yarn scraps for hat filling
- 1 toilet paper roll
- Scissors
- Fine tooth brush (optional)

NOTES

1. Yarn colors for this project are personal preference- I alternated 3 colors.
2. Scarf length is personal preference as well, cut strands to desired scarf length
3. You will only use a small amount of each skein and will have plenty left for more cozies or other projects

BEGIN HAT COZY PATTERN

- 1: Begin by cutting 1/2 inch section off of the toilet paper roll (scale size depending on how big you would like the base of the hat to be.
- 2: Cut 15 (10 inch) strands of yarn for each color you want to include. In total you will need 45 (10 inch) strands of yarn.
- 3: Fold each strand of yarn in half- then tuck the closed end underneath the toilet paper roll and put the two loose ends through it. Pull tight until the strand is secured to the base of the hat (TP roll).
- 4: Repeat step 3 (45 TIMES) until entire base is covered in yarn strands.
- 5: Gather all 45 secured strands and tie together using scrap yarn. Leave about a 1.5 inch of space in between tie and base of hat.
- 6: To give the hat structure, stuff the inside of the hat with stuffing or extra yarn scraps
- 7: Cut the excess yarn from the top to desired length for pom.
- 8: Brush the remaining yarn on top with a fine tooth brush or pull apart each strand with fingers until yarn is separated and fluffy.
- 9: Trim as needed to shape into round pom.

BEGIN SCARF COZY PATTERN

- 1: Begin scarf by cutting 30 (12 INCH) strands of each color you would like to include in the scarf. (I did 10 strands of each color)
- 2: Gather all strands together and with an extra piece of scrap yarn tie the end of one side tightly leaving about 1/4 inch of yarn on the ends.
- 3: Separate the strands into 3 sections (10 each using all colors) and begin to braid them.
- 4: Tie the end of the braid using a scrap piece of yarn and leave about 1/4 inch on the end.
- 5: Bush both ends of the scarf with a fine tooth brush or separate strands with fingers until fluffy. Trim as needed to form poms.
