



Tassel Wall Hanger

Tassel Wall Hanger



SIZE

Finished Height Approximately 36 inches tall Finished Width Approximately 24 inches wide

GAUGE

Not applicable for this pattern

MATERIALS

- Clover Tassel Maker (large)
- Clover Patchwork Scissors
- 1 skein EACH of Lion Brand Re-Spun Yarn in 'Cider', 'Parchment', 'Amber', and 'Cornsilk'
- Dritz Clothesline or Macrame cordage (about 15 yards)
- 3/4 inch Wooden Dowel cut to 2 inches

TASSEL WALL HANGER

- 1. Cut a 6 inch and 12 inch length of yarn from the color you are working with. Set aside. Wrap your yarn around the tassel maker approximately 35 times. With the 6 inch length of yarn, tie all the strands you have just wound together directly in the middle of the maker between the two white pegs. Cut along both short sides of the maker to remove your tassel.
- Fold your tassel in half along the knot you've made. Taking the 12 inch length of yarn, begin wrapping around the tassel about an inch from the fold to create the tassel's head. After about 7-9 wraps, tie both ends of the 12 inch length of yarn together with 2 knots. Smooth tassel and trim to a uniform length.
- 3. Following steps 1-2, make 5 tassels with the yarn color 'Cider', 7 tassels in 'Parchment', 9 tassels in 'Amber', and 11 tassels in 'Cornsilk.'
- 4. Cut 5 lengths of cording at 40 inches, 52 inches, 60 inches, 68 inches, and 76 inches. Set aside the shortest length.
- 5. Through the head of the tassels, thread all 5 'Cider' tassels onto the 52 inch length of cording. Thread the 7 'Parchment' tassels onto the 60 inch length of cording, the 9 'Amber' tassels onto the 68 inch length of cording, and the 11 'Cornsilk' tassels onto the 76 inch length of cording. Knot the ends of all cording using an overhand knot.
- 6. Fasten the 'Cider' cord onto the dowel using a cow hitch knot on either side. Fasten the 'Parchment' cording to the dowel in the same way on the outside of the 'Cider' cording. Fasten the 'Amber' cording in the same manner, followed by the 'Cornsilk' cording.
- 6. Adjust the tassels and cording on the dowel to your liking. Each knotted end of cording should hang 6 inches down.
- 7. Knot the ends of the shortest length of cording and tie both ends to the dowel using an overhand knot on the outside of the 'Cornsilk' cording, leaving a length of about 7 inches hanging down on either side.
- 9. Create a tassel for each knotted cording end in its corresponding color following steps 1-2. Before tying your 6 inch strand of yarn, place the cording knot in the middle of the maker between all of your wrapped strands of yarn. Tie your 6 inch strand over the cording knot before cutting the tassel off the maker. Choose any color tassel for the hanging cord color.

Optional Continuation

Use the hanging cord tassel to tie back the other cording end tassels!
