



Turkey Hat

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FASV

SIZE

With hat lying flat:

Approx. 10 inches in diameter Approx. 9 inches from top to bottom

GAUGE

Lion Brand Homespun: 7 hdc x 6 rows= 3 in. x 3 in

Lion Brand Vanna's Choice: 13 hdc x 10 rows - 4 in, x 4 in.

Be sure to check your gauge.

MATERIALS

- approx. 120 yards of Lion Brand Homespun in Wildfire (Brown)
- approx. 30 yards of Lion Brand Vanna's Choice in Fisherman for the bone on the drumstick (Bone)
- K10.5/6.5mm and H8/5.00mm crochet hooks
- stitch marker or small piece of yarn in a contrasting color

- scissors
- tapestry needle
- optional: a couple of straight pins

NOTES

RS of your work should show on the outside of each piece

STITCH EXPLANATION

dec- in this pattern, "dec" indicates an hdc decrease worked in FLO: YO, pick up FLO of next st, then pick up FLO of following st, YO and pull through 2 loops, YO and pull through remaining 3 loops.

hdc2tog- half double crochet two together: YO, insert hook into next stitch, YO, pull through 1 loop. YO, insert hook into following stitch, YO, pull through 1 loop. YO and pull through all 5 loops.

tr cluster- Slip next 2 sts as if to knit, one at a time, to right needle; insert left needle into fronts of these 2 sts and knit them together – 1 st decreased.

HAT

With Brown and K hook, make a magic circle or ch 3 and sl st to 1st ch to form a ring

Rnd 1: Ch 1, 6 sc into ring. SI st to 1st sc to join. – 6 sts

Rnd 2: Ch 1, (2 sc) into each st. SI st to 1st sc to join. - 12 sts

- At this point, your circle should be about 1.75 inches in diameter.

Rnds 3-7: Ch 1, sc evenly around. SI St to 1st sc to join. – 12 sts

Rnd 8: Ch 1, (sc, hdc) in 1st st, (2 hdc) in rest of sts. Don't join rnds. Work in a spiral for rest of Hat. – 24 sts

Rnd 9: (2 hdc) in each st. – 48 sts **Rnd 10:** [(2 hdc), 5 hdc] 8 times. – 56 sts

Work evenly in hdc for the rest of the hat. To create the nubbly texture, substitute random hdc's with a tr cluster here and there. After working the hdc following a tr, remember to pop the cluster toward you with your finger so that all the nubs are on the outside of the hat (the RS of your work should be the outside of your hat).

I worked about 13 rnds of hdc (plus random tr clusters). My hat measured about 9 inches from the tippy top to the bottom, and 10 inches across the bottom when the hat is lying flat. You can easily adjust the length according to your needs by working fewer or more rnds.

Rnds 11-23: Hdc evenly around, randomly substituting occasional hdc's with tr's. After your last hdc, sc in next st, sl st in next st, and break off. Weave in both ends.

DRUMSTICK EAR FLAPS - Make 2

With Brown and K hook, make a magic circle or ch 3 and sl st to 1st ch to form a ring

Rnd 1: Ch 2, 8 hdc into ring. SI st to 1st hdc to join. – 8 sts

Rnd 2: Ch 2, (2 hdc) in same space and in each hdc around. SI st to 1st hdc to join. – 16 sts

- As your drumstick starts to take shape, remember to keep the RS of your work on the outside of the drumstick.

Rnd 3: Ch 2, [(2 hdc), 3 hdc] 4 times. SI st to 1st hdc to join. – 20 sts

Rnds 4-7: hdc evenly around. – 20 sts Rnd 8: Ch 2, [dec, 2 hdc] 5 times. SI st to 1st st to join. – 15 sts

Rnd 9: Ch 2, [dec, hdc] 5 times. SI st to 1st st to join. – 10 sts

Rnd 10: Ch 2, hdc evenly around. SI st to 1st hdc to join. – 10 sts

-Break off Brown and join Bone with H hook.

Rnds 11-13: Ch 2, 10 hdc evenly around. SI st to 1st hdc to join. – 10 sts

-Now you're going to make two ball-like bone nubs. Imagine splitting your current circle of 10 stitches into two halves - one half for each ball.

CROCHET





Rnds 14: Ch 2, (2 hdc) 5 times. Leave remaining sts unworked. SI st to 1st hdc to join. – 10 sts

Rnd 15: Ch 2, hdc2tog 5 times. Sl st to 1st st to join. – 5 sts

- Break off. Weave in both ends. You can stitch up the 5-stitch-hole if you want to while you weave in your ends.

Rnd 14a: To create the 2nd nub, re-join Bone into the next free st from Rnd 13, to work all the incomplete stitches for Rnd 14. Ch 2, (2 hdc) each into remaining 5 sts. SI st to 1st hdc of current rnd to join – 10 sts Rnd 15a: Repeat Round 15.

- Break off. Weave in both ends. You can stitch up the opening if you want to while you weave in your ends
- Weave in Brown ends

ASSEMBLY

Try the hat on and see where the drumsticks should go against your ears. Pinin place if you like. The drumsticks usually don't sit exactly at the midpoint of the hat. They are slightly off center, so there will be a bit more space between the drumsticks at the forehead than at the back of the head.

With a tapestry needle and about 18 inches of Brown, sew both drumsticks onto the hat as earflaps as shown in the diagram. Make sure that the seam on each drumstick from joining rounds is hidden toward the inside of the hat and not showing on the outside.

ABBREVIATIONS

ch(s) = chain(s)

dec = in this pattern, it's an hdc decrease -see Special Stiches

FLO = front loop only

hdc = half double crochet

hdc2tog = half double crochet two together- see Special Stitches

rnd(s) = round(s)

RS = right side

sc = single crochet

sk = skip

sl st = slip stitch

st(s) = stitch(es)
