

Lyla Baskets

Designed by Margaux Hufnagel / Skill level: Intermediate



FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Small circular basket:

Approximately 4½" / 11.5 cm
across bottom x 3½" / 9 cm high

Taller handled basket:

Approximately 11" / 28 cm across
bottom x 10¾" / 27.5 cm high

YARN

BERROCO VERNAZZA (50 grs):

1 ball #10630 Sigrì (MC) for Small
Circular Basket;

1 ball #10633 Ona (C1) and 2 balls
#10635 Zumaia (C2) for Taller
Handled Basket

HOOKS and NOTIONS

Crochet hook, size 4.5 mm or size
to obtain gauge

Removable stitch markers

GAUGE

18 sc and 22 rnds = 4" / 10 cm in sc

*Gauge is measured after blocking.
To save time and ensure accurate
measurements, take time to check
gauge.*

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We recommend using yarns called for in our instructions. Every effort has been made to ensure that directions contained in this pattern are accurate and complete, however errors do occur. CONSTRUCTION NOTES

Both baskets are worked in the round from the bottom up.

SMALL CIRCULAR BASKET

Using MC, begin with a sliding loop.

Work 10 sc in loop, join with a sl st in beg sc.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—20 sc. Pull up loop to tighten center and secure.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, * sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; rep from * around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—30 sc.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, * sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc; rep from * around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—40 sc.

Rnd 4: Ch 1, * sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc; rep from * around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—50 sc.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, * sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc; rep from * around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—60 sc.

Rnd 6: Ch 1, * sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc; rep from * around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—70 sc.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, * sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc; rep from * around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—80 sc.

Rnd 8: Ch 1, * sc in next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc; rep from * around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—90 sc.

Rnd 9: Ch 1, * sc in next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc; rep from * around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—100 sc.

Rnd 10: Ch 1, * sc in next 9 sc, 2 sc in next sc; rep from * around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—110 sc.



Turning Rnd: Ch 1, sctbl in each sc around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—110 sc.

Next Rnd: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—110 sc.

Rep the last round until you have approximately 6" / 15 cm of yarn left, or desired height. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends and block as desired.

TALLER HANDLED BASKET

Using C1, ch 100, join with a sl st for working in the round.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc in each ch around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—100 sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join with a sl st in beg ch-1.

Rep Rnd 2 until piece measures $3\frac{3}{4}$ " / 9.5 cm, or until you have used almost the entire ball of C1, saving a small amount for sewing the bottom of the bag. Break off C1, change to C2 and work in sc as established until bag measures approximately $9\frac{1}{2}$ " / 24 cm from bottom edge.

Make Handles: Flatten bag and measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " / 9 cm in from edges on both the front and back of the bag and mark with removable markers—4 markers total.

Next Rnd: Ch 1, * work in sc to marker, ch 16 (handle opening), skip 16 sc; rep from * once more, work in sc to end, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—68 sc and 2 ch-16 spaces (handle openings).

Next Rnd: Ch 1, * work in sc to ch-16 sp, 16 sc in sp; rep from * once more, work in sc to end, join with a sl st in beg ch-1—100 sc.

Work even in sc as established until handle measures approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ " / 4 cm from opening, or until approximately 6" / 15 cm of C2 yarn remain. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Fold basket in half and sew bottom (C1) edges together. Turn inside out and press the corners out flat. Measure in 1" / 2.5 cm in each direction from both ends of center seam and place markers. On one end of seam, sew from one marker, across seam, to the other marker. Repeat on the other end of seam. This creates a box-like seam on bottom of basket. Weave in all ends and block as desired.

Note: Berroco patterns use American crochet terms

beg: beginning

BLO: back loop only

BP: back post

BPdc: back post double crochet

BPhdc: back post half double crochet

BPsc: back post single crochet

BPtc: back post treble crochet

CC: contrasting color

cont: continue

ch: chain

dec: decrease

dc: double crochet

dc2tog: double crochet 2 stitches together

dtr: double treble crochet

est: established

FLO: front loop only

est: established

FP: front post

FPdc: front post double crochet

FPhdc: front post half double crochet

FPsc: front post single crochet

FPTc: front post treble crochet

hdc: half double crochet

hdc2tog: half double crochet 2 stitches together

inc: increase

MC: main color

pat(s): pattern(s)

pm: place marker

rep: repeat

rnd(s): round(s)

RS: right side

sc: single crochet

sc2tog: single crochet 2 stitches together

sl st: slip stitch

sliding loop: Form a loop of yarn around your fingers, with the end attached to the ball on the right and the tail on the left. Insert hook into the loop under both pieces of yarn and draw up a loop onto hook. (This does not count as your first stitch.) Work first row into the original loop. Pull up the yarn tail after your first row is complete to close the loop.

sp: space

st(s): stitch(es)

tog: together

tr: treble

WS: wrong side

yo: yarn over
