

Pennant Garland

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BASIC

SIZE

Finished Garland Length About 60 in. (152.5 cm) Finished Pennant About 7 x 4 in. (18 x 10 cm), at widest and longest

GAUGE

18 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Garter st (k every st of every row).

Exact gauge is not essential for this project.

MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® HEARTLAND® (Art. #136)
 #130 Bryce Canyon 1 ball (A)
 #105 Glacier Bay 1 ball (B)
 #135 Yosemite 1 ball (C)
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle

Knitting needles size 9 (5.5 mm) Crochet hook size J-10 (6 mm)

NOTES

- 1. Garland is made from 5 Pennants and a Hanging Cord.
- Pennants are worked in rows from the lower tip up to top edge.

STITCH EXPLANATION

yo (yarn over - at beginning of a row)

An increase that creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) at the beg of the row, worked as follows:

- 1. Bring the working yarn forward and then over the right needle to the back.
- 2. Insert tip of right needle into first st on left needle and knit the st as usual.
- 3. You will now have 2 sts on the right needle.

PENNANTS (make 5 - 2 each with A and B, and 1 with C)

With knitting needles, cast on 1 st. **Row 1:** Yo, k1 – you will have 2 sts in this row.

Rows 2-32: Yo, k to end of row – 33 sts in Row 32. Bind off.

HANGING CORD

With crochet hook and C, work a chain about 60 in. (152 cm) long. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in yarn ends on Pennants.

Thread Hanging Cord through top of each Pennant, threading up through top corner, down through center of top edge, and then up through opposite top corner of Pennant. Space Pennants out evenly along Hanging Cord.
