

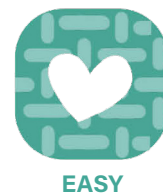

Vintage Camelia Wall Hanging

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SIZE

Finished Diameter:
6"

MATERIALS

- Cascade Yarns® Cascade 220®
100% Peruvian Highland Wool;
100 g (3.5 oz), 220 yds (200 m);
 - 1 skein each: #2401 Burgundy (A),
#9861 Crabapple (B), #9463 B Gold (C),
#1054 Mallard Blue (D)
- Monk's cloth
- Adjustable punch needle (3 mm).
Recommended needle length: 1 3/8ths in.
(3.5 cm)
- 6 inch wooden embroidery hoop
- Ribbon or yarn for hanging
- Fabric pen
- Yarn needle
- Fabric glue (optional)
- Carbon paper (optional)

DIRECTIONS

PLACE CLOTH IN EMBROIDERY HOOP

Place the monk's cloth in the embroidery hoop. Leave at least 4 inches of extra cloth around the hoop. Tighten the hoop, then make sure the cloth is taut by gently but firmly pulling on the fabric around the edges.

TRACE PATTERN ONTO CLOTH

Print out pattern. Make sure the measurement line at the bottom of the pattern is 7 inches when printed out.

Cut out the pattern using the outer circle. Tape the pattern onto the fabric on the front of the embroidery hoop. Trace the pattern on the back of the cloth by using a lightbox or holding the hoop up to a window.

Alternatively, trace pattern onto cloth using carbon paper.

FILL IN THE PATTERN

Follow punch needle manufacturing directions to thread your punch needle.

Hold the needle so that the hole in the needle (where the yarn comes out) always faces back. Make sure your yarn has a lot of slack: the yarn should move freely through the needle. Push the needle all the way down through an opening in the cloth. The needle shouldn't break any of the threads.

Pull the needle back up through the cloth but make sure the needle tip stays at the surface of the cloth. Slide the needle about 1/4th of an inch, then push the needle back into the cloth. This creates a loop on the front and a flat stitch on the back.

Fill each section with the corresponding color. The easiest method is to trace the edges and then fill in the rest with a spiral pattern.

FINISHING

Trim the ends and any particularly long loops.

Fold the edges of the cloth towards the back of the hoop. Using a yarn needle and extra yarn, cinch together the extra monk's cloth with a running stitch. Or use fabric glue to glue down the edges.

Attach a loop of ribbon or yarn to the closure of the embroidery hoop.
